Mr. [redacted] and Mr. Greg Mullan. Others present were: D/C/Supt. McBurney, Supt. Anderson, Sgt. [redacted] and D/C [redacted] P39

Mr. McBurney briefed those present re: investigation. Mr. [redacted] outlined his role: to primarily investigate the complaint - FAILURE of Police to do their job properly and effectively. He felt that all witnesses should be invited to speak to the investigation team. That individuals should be personally written to and invited in. If necessary, Supt. [redacted] should also

be written to and invited in at a venue of their choice. He also stated that although the complainant did not witness the incident that there may be some benefits in communicating with her, in order to assist witnesses to come forward.

Mr. [redacted] stated that he had to be conscious of any proposed venue and of the number of persons present during interviews of witnesses. These should be kept to minimum. He would be present during these interviews and would ensure that the persons were aware that the investigation was in relation to the complaint re: Police, not the murder investigation and the allegation made by witness 'A'.
