I had these persons in my view for approximately 20 seconds, they would have been 15 yards away from me at the furthest point and approximately 5 yards at the closest. The street lighting in Thomas Street is particularly good and the night in question the weather was fine and dry. These were the only persons in the street when I was looking out at this time. I had never seen any of the persons which I have mentioned here before. I then saw the person that I have described as number (1) running down Thomas Street towards Market Street on the Jamiesons Bar side, as he approached the junction of Thomas Street/Market Street he hit out with his right arm and appeared to connect with a person who was standing at this junction. The assault appeared to be on this person's face, it was at this point I realised that it was my girlfriend's brother who was the victim of this assault. I turned to my girlfriend and asked her is that your brother who had just been hit and she said that it was. Myself and Carol-Ann then went downstairs to the main door to see if he was alright. When we got there, Carol-Ann's brother was standing only feet from the front door. We asked him did he want to come in and get off side and he told us that he did. David that's Carol-Ann's brother appeared to me to be drunk. Then we all went back upstairs. Myself and Carol-Ann looked at David's face and it appeared to fine. I then went back over to the window and looked out, all I seen at this stage were these people lying on the road and I know that it was the first two persons that I had described. There appeared to be approximately
