

STATEMENT OF JENNIFER CAROL ONEILL

heard shouting coming from the direction of the town centre. The three of us stood at the green gate at the side of St Mark's Church and looked down the street. I could see approximately twenty people in the middle of the street, about the middle of the town, about ten of these people were fighting with each other. I observed people throwing punches at each other and others running about. I heard people shouting, "Fenian bastards," and there was one fellow shouting, "Orange bastards," I could see a police car parked outside Wellworths. I observed it drive up the street with the two tone horns on. It was one of them police cars with the stripes, it parked about Wellworths. I didn't see anybody lying on the street. The crowd that was fighting was a good distance down the street from me. There was a fair crowd standing around beside us and I spoke to Noelle Moore, I just met her as I started to walk off. Noelle lives in Portadown I think [REDACTED], she was with other girls, about three. I only know them to see. I then walked on home with Vicky. I stayed at Vicky's house that night. Kyle left us at the bridge on the Armagh Road. I don't know where Kyle went after that. I can remember looking behind me when I got to the security barrier at the top of Magowan Buildings. I could see a crowd of people walking up the street towards us and I could see police behind them moving them up the street. On that Saturday night I was wearing cream coloured trousers, black boots, navy polo neck sweater, with a light blue band across the centre of it. I was also wearing a blue denim jacket, which I had buttoned up, waist length.
