STATEMENT OF: ANDREA LOUISE MCKEE

Police Station from our gym. As a result of that phone call, I then accompanied Davy to go and meet two police officers. It was dark when I met the two police officers and I told them that Tracy Clarke knew about the fighting and what she had seen. I do not remember mentioning to the officers about what Tracy Clarke had said about Robert Atkinson. On the following day which was a Friday, I was speaking to Tracy Clarke's mother Irene who told me that Tracy had to go to Portadown Police Station to speak to the police. I was not aware that she had been spoken to the previous night. Irene asked Michael to pick Tracy up from her part-time job at the Chinese Restaurant in West Street and take her to the police station. I went with Michael, picked Tracy up and sent to the Police Station with her. I remember that it was quite late. I remained with Tracy while she was being interviewed and a police woman called P39 brought Tracy and myself home. Michael had dropped us off and had went on home to set with [REDACTED] and await us coming home. At some point after this, I recall Robert Atkinson telling me that Tracy Clarke had been to the Police Station and had made a statement, this occurred not long after this but I do not know when. Tracy Clarke was very worried about making a statement and Michael and his father Jim did talk to her advising her to tell the police about what she knew. In the days that followed, Alistair Hanvey was charged and appeared before court. I cannot recall being in any discussion with Robert Atkinson at that time and I do not know what his reaction was to Alistair being charged. I am not personally aware of any direct conversations between Robert Atkinson and the Hanvey's over this period. The only contact I was aware of was when Tracy told me that Alistair Hanvey had told her that Robert Atkinson had rang his dad. I do know that Robert
