

NOTE FOR FILE

I spoke by phone with Lawrence Marshall this morning at around 11.30 am. He informed me as follows.

A small spot of blood (identified as Bridgett's blood) was found on Hamill's trouser leg 1 or 2 inches above the bottom of the hem. It was a round spot no bigger than a one pence coin. There was one other spot of blood near to this spot but it was not tested.

The blood on the left trouser leg did not come from Bridgett and was smeared and thus different from Bridgett's spot.

The fact that the blood was not in an elongated shape means that there is nothing to indicate what direction the blood came from.

Mr Marshall was reluctant to offer any interpretation as to how the blood got there but said it was consistent with Hamill lying on the ground and a drop of Bridgett's blood falling as he stood over Hamill.

I phoned Crumlin Road to speak to Gordon Kerr at 12.20 pm after speaking to Mr Kitson. He was not available but phoned me back at around 2.00 pm. I briefly outlined what Mr Marshall had said to me. He said he would consider the matter and meet me tomorrow 18 November 1997 at 10.00 am to discuss the evidence.
