On 22 June 2000 I received a telephone call from the Chief Constable.

He referred to the case of Robert Hamill.

He stated that in the initial investigation an allegation had been made in regard to a telephone call made, I believe he said, by a Reserve Constable. The Chief Constable placed this telephone call in the context of Witness A.

The matter had been investigated and although it was alleged that the call was improper, it had been accepted that it was innocent.

The Chief Constable stated that Mr McBurney had now interviewed the relevant police officer and he had "changed his story". Contact had been made with the Independent Commission for Police Complaints and further enquiries would ensue.

The Chief Constable sought a point of contact for guidance. I told him that the case officer was Raymond Kitson.
