On one occasion after that but before Michael and myself made statements to the police, Michael and myself were over at Robert Atkinson's house. We went there to sort out the cover story for the phone call Robert Atkinson made to Alistair Hanvey the morning after the fighting in Portadown. Robert and Eleanor Atkinson were both present. Robert Atkinson led the discussion and he said that the story would be that Michael and I had been staying at their house overnight and he suggested that the call could be covered by Michael saying that he was ringing because of his concern for Tracy Clarke. It was Robert who thought out this story about Tracy Clarke. Robert Atkinson said to me that I would have to confirm that I had heard Michael on the telephone. Robert Atkinson mentioned about a second phone call that he had made but that he had that covered. I do not know anything about the second phone call, about his reason for making it, or his story to cover it. We were only there that evening to get the story right and we went home again after that. At some point after that, I was aware that Michael and Eleanor went to Portadown Police Station to make statements. I was aware that Robert Atkinson was being interviewed again but I was not asked by Robert to go to the Police Station.
