

with brown wavy hair. I can not recall what the other man looked like but I grabbed one of them by the arm but in the end this man got away. I do not know what happened to the man that Constable Neill was originally struggling with but I checked with Constable Neill to see if he was okay and he said that he was, so I left him at the Land Rover and went back over to the injured men. I was then approached by another female wearing a blue jacket, dark trousers with shoulder-length hair who was crying and very distressed. I tried to comfort her. I do not if she knew the injured men but I assumed she did as she was so upset.

19. At this stage the crowd were back from the injured men but were still in Market Street. There were other officers in support there by this stage. My colleagues from the Land Rover were trying to restrain the crowd whilst I stayed with the injured men until the ambulance arrived. I did not recognise anybody in the crowd or see anyone going towards the bodies. It seemed like an eternity had passed from when I had first got out of the Land Rover until the ambulance eventually arrived. I do not recall either man regaining consciousness whilst I was with them. I recall one ambulance in attendance but there may have been two. As soon as the paramedics arrived they went straight to the injured men and I left them to do their job. I did not speak to them and I do not recall any of the women talking to them.
20. By the time that ambulance had arrived more police officers were at the scene and I think that there was a local police car from Banbridge. I recall that the Mobile Support Unit was also at the scene at some stage but I cannot remember when they arrived. I do not remember seeing an Inspector at the scene but I think there was a Sergeant there. When the ambulance arrived the police had formed a line and were trying to push the crowd back up Market Street and on to West Street. I do not know if any of the officers had their batons drawn but I did not carry one. At that time female officers were not issued with batons. I did not see any riot guns at the scene.
21. At this time, people in the crowd were still shouting but I could see that some of them had left and walked on up the street. I did not see any fighting or bottles
