

being thrown but could hear glass smashing. It has been pointed out to me that I said in my 1997 statement that there were "approximately 50 Protestants and 10 Catholics" but I cannot remember where these Catholics were. I know that the crowd that was pushed back by officers was made up of Protestant youths. I remember the word "Fenians" being shouted out and that there were two groups at the scene, but I do not recall one group attacking the other group; there was just different people fighting within a massive crowd. I did not recognise or know any person in the crowd.

22. Things eventually calmed down and I remember leaving the scene about 03.30 and finishing duty at 03.45. At this time I cannot remember if there were any senior officers at the scene or if I was given any instructions by any other officers before I left. I was told to stand down but I cannot remember who gave me that order. I do remember speaking to Constable Neill before I went back to the station to change and go home. I went back to the station with the Reserve Constables P40 and Atkinson, and Constable Neill. I changed my clothes, completed my notebook and went home. Normally we received a briefing before we terminated duty but I cannot remember being given a briefing that morning or any instructions before I went home.

23. I recall later being called at home and told to come back to the station. I got back to the station by about 06.00-06.30. I cannot recall who phoned me but when I arrived at the station I saw the other members of the Land Rover crew. We went in to the CID office and there were other officers there. We were told that there had been two people injured at the scene and one of them was seriously ill. I do not know which officer gave us this information but we were told to make statements about what had happened that morning. I had already completed my notebook before I had terminated duty that morning. I think we were all in the CID office together making our statements but I cannot remember if we discussed what had happened. At this stage I was exhausted and I just wanted to get back home and into bed. When I finished making my statement I handed it in. I cannot remember to whom and I cannot remember if I also handed in my notebook. After that I left and went back home. It was about 09.30 when I left the station.
