15.5.97: D/Superintendent McBurney and D/Inspector Irwin

Attended Mr Kitson's office.

They had been to see Professor Crane re his PM findings. Professor Crane was standing by his initial findings, that is to say that the cause of death was the head injury but that in itself would or should not have caused death. Other contributory factors (such as alcohol consumed by deceased, position in which deceased lay when on road, starvation of oxygen to brain during the incident) were likely to be present. Septicaemia was only a possibility. Further tests were to be carried out by Professor Crane within next two weeks. His full report was a minimum five weeks away.
