



5. I also knew of St Patrick's Hall on Thomas Street as a Catholic community centre of sorts. However I was not aware there was a function taking place at the Hall on the night of 26 April 1997.
6. At the time I knew Stacey Bridgett and Marc Hobson, who both lived close by. I also knew Timothy Jameson, who was in my class at school but I would not say we were friends. I also knew Kyle Magee from school. I knew 'Fonzie' Allen and Allister Hanvey from going to the Coach Inn. I still know Stacey Bridgett and Andrew Osborne who are friends of mine.
7. In 1997 I would go to the Coach Inn at Banbridge regularly on the bus, usually with Paul Currie who was a mate of mine and lived just around the corner from me. I knew his brother Mark but not as well as I did Paul
8. On 26 April 1997, I recall I went to the Coach Inn at Banbridge by bus with Paul Currie. I got the bus back to town and got off by Herrons Country Fried Chicken. I did not stop to get any food and I would have been one of the first to get off the bus. I just walked straight up the town towards West Street with Paul Currie on my way home. I did not notice any shouting or calling going on near Thomas Street as I walked home; there was virtually no one else in the town centre.
9. It has been put to me that Kyle Magee made a statement about the events of 26/27 April 1997 to police on 30 April 1997. In that statement [Page 9144] Kyle said he saw me hanging around the summer seats near St Marks' Church watching the fight. After getting off the bus from the Coach Inn, I walked past the church on my way home, but I would not have been hanging around at the church and I did not see any fighting. I did not go to Tracy Newell/McAlpine's house at any time that night.
10. I have been asked whether I knew Davy Woods back in April 1997. I knew him from being on the bus from the Coach Inn. He wasn't a friend of mine but I knew

his face and name. I do not recall seeing him in town on the evening of 26/27 April 1997.

11. The first I knew of the fight that night was through the newspapers and TV. I would not have spoken to anyone about it because I would have wanted to keep to myself, and because I was not involved. If I had seen anything that night of relevance I probably would not have come forward. At the time it was fairly common for people from the Brownstown Estate to keep to themselves and avoid contact with the Police.
