What difference.

HOBSON

That one has buttons on it and the other one has a zip.

Well I will mention another jacket. Now this one has police identification mark GW1. One black leather jacket with the name Rocky Leather on it. Would you have been wearing that one on Sunday the 27th of April 1997.

HOBSON

No I think it was the other one I was wearing.

So you think it was the Classic one.

HOBSON

Yes.

Police identification mark GW2 refers to a pair of blue Pepe jeans. Blue Pepe jeans, would you have been wearing those on Sunday the 27th of April.

HOBSON

I have another pair of blue Pepe jeans, I was wearing anyone, so I was.

How many pairs of blue Pepe jeans have you.

HOBSON

A few but there is only two dark pairs that I have and it was a dark pair I was wearing.

Well would it have been that pair.

HOBSON

Aye it might have been but the other pair is dark too, aren't they.

Yes.

HOBSON

Aye it was between one of them two anyway.

Either one of the two pairs that you have been shown.

HOBSON

Yes.

The last two items here, a pair of trainers, a pair of Airmac training shoes. Police identification mark GW3 and GW3A refer. Were you wearing those on the night, the morning in

question.

HOBSON

Yes.

Last but not least, GW4 is the police identification mark and it refers to a grey Nike tee-shirt. Do you recall having this tee-shirt on on the morning in question.

HOBSON

Yes I think it might have been that tee-shirt, I am not too sure. I think it was that one.

Right. That's everything.
