

This is a continuation of the interview of Mr Robert Atkinson. Eh the time, by my watch is seven minutes past one and just to remind you, Mr Atkinson you are still under caution as you are aware, there was a break in tapes there for a few seconds; just to remind you, you are still under caution in accordance with Article 3 of the Criminal Evidence (Northern Ireland) Order, You do not have to say anything, but I must caution you that if you do not mention when questioned, something which you later rely on in Court, it may harm your defence. If you do say anything it may be given in evidence. You appreciate you are still under caution.

ATKINSON

I do.

We are dealing with the issue of where people were in your house whenever you come in, where was your kitchen in relation to your house area. I have never been in your house.

ATKINSON

Just straight off the hall.

So it's possible for you to come through your hallway to go upstairs to your bedroom and people in your kitchen not to see them.

ATKINSON

I don't normally come through the hall, I usually come through the kitchen.

So you actually come through the kitchen.

ATKINSON

Yes.

Well was Michael (buzzer), is the tapes moving, are they - yeah they are moving but ehm the buzzer must mean we have a faulty tape or something. I'll have to stop it and - aye - because we don't even know if it's still recording.
