GS - Would account for calls but not account for your non presence there. No record of you being there. No Doctor recalls you. No documents sent to your GP. Police investigation show you were never there. Is it the case that you were never there at all?

A [REDACTED] - No, I discussed it with my partner. Thought I had given the wrong date but we agreed that this was the correct date.

GS - You apparently had a medical apparently on Tuesday 23rd December in relation to your job.

A [REDACTED] - Yeah

GS - When was that arranged?

A [REDACTED] - I would have a letter at home.

GS - Date for some time?

A [REDACTED] - I had an interview and then the letter.

GS - Did you take your child?

A [REDACTED] - Left with mother

GS - Had he made an improvement?

A [REDACTED] - No

GS - You said you didn't want to leave the child when speaking to Ms Murphy

A [REDACTED] - I felt ok about that

GS - It creates problems. Defence want to know why the case was adjourned. No record of you doing what you said

A [REDACTED] - No, Been to Pendine twice before.

GS - Said Dr had grey hair. There's no grey haired Dr.

A - I waited - my partner took [REDACTED] (child) in to see the Dr.

GS - Very odd on the face of it. Suspicious that you didn't do that. Can you think of any explanation?

A - No

GS - One is that it mightn't be the truth.

GS - very surprising

A - That was making me think about [REDACTED]

GS - But nobody remembers. Six Doctors or receptionists. The evidence depends on your honesty. You have already been convicted of a criminal offence. Was it because you were trying to avoid giving evidence.

A - My son was unwell. I felt I should not have to justify that.

GS - You would be pressed that that was a lie to enable you to get out of giving evidence.

A - I know

GS - About the letter. Was it out of the blue?

A - Yes

GS - Have you been in contact with your friend?

AJ - Glynnis

GS - Does she know your address?

A - Yes

GS - Are you still willing to give evidence?

A - Yes

GS - 19th March next in court to fix a date. You didn't say to Ms Murphy on Friday that your son was unwell.

A - Didn't realise I didn't say that.

A - Met her once before

GS - You weren't trying to engineer a situation.

A - I had no reason to do that. Have no problem with that.

GS - Defence will want to know

A - I know that

IM - Explained the issue. We know [REDACTED] was unwell but the Pendine matter is causing a big problem.

GS - The grey haired Doctor. Was he a male Doctor?

A - He was

GS - Is there any explanation?

A - Cant recall which phone

A - Spoke to surgery before 8.30am.

A - Given an emergency appointment.

GS - What is your evidence to the letter, to give evidence?

A - I am fully committed to giving evidence but have to know that I am safe.

GS - You didn't expect to get that letter?

A - No

GS - Conditions

A - An address that nobody knows

When asked A stated that Wrexham is home for work and studies and Scotland is too far away. Glynnis is a close friend but would stop contacting her if it was for her own security.
