Spoke to [REDACTED]
& his wife in his front
sitting room. I told him that
we were here to speak
to him about his observations
on the early hours of 27-4-97
I told him that we had
investigated various aspects of
the circumstances of the murder
of Robert Hamill & subsequent
events the following day -
I explained that our
interest with him was purely
his observations that night/
early hours of the morning.
I told him that if there
was anything he wanted
to tell us it would be
treated totally confidentially
& if he wanted to make a
statement he could be noted
as witness A etc. I then
asked him to recall the
events of that night. He
stated he couldn't really
remember very much about
it. I then showed him
a typed copy of document
468 which I told him I
believed was his account
of what he had observed

that night from Thomas Street. He took it & read it. His wife P41 leaned over and also read it. When they finished I asked them if this was the document typed by [REDACTED] & dictated by P42 they both agreed that it was. I then said that I believed this document in its original form had been submitted as anonymous information at the time of the murder by [REDACTED] father [REDACTED] she agreed with this. I asked [REDACTED] was this a true & accurate account of his observations from his flat that night. He said it was. I asked how did he come to make it. He said that he dictated & [REDACTED] typed it. I asked was there any other original hand written notes. He stated there wasn't. I enquired if he was alone when he made these observations - He stated he was alone.

I asked where his flat was & he stated he couldn't remember. I asked him for the flat number. Again he said he couldn't remember.

I asked [REDACTED] was she going out with him at the time she stated she was but she never had any reason to write to him at the flat & therefore couldn't remember the number.

I then asked [REDACTED] whereabouts was the flat in Thomas Street. He stated he couldn't really remember.

I asked [REDACTED] this & she stated that she couldn't really remember either. I asked how long had he been in it he said about 1 year. I asked what age was he at that time & he said he couldn't remember. I asked what age was he now & he said 31. I asked [REDACTED] where the flat was & she stated she couldn't remember. I asked [REDACTED] was he there on DHSS benefits. He stated

he wasn't because he remembered
sitting with his parents
sorting out his finances to
see if he could afford it
I then gave them a few
land marks such as
Jamesons bar & the Church
on the end of Thomas Street.
I asked was it on the left
or right of the street as
you headed up from
the town centre. He
said the left. I asked
how he came to see the
events he had outlined in
the document. He said he
couldn't really be 100% sure
but thought he had been in
bed & heard a noise &
got up & witnessed the
events although he couldn't
remember very clearly
now. He went on to say
that he couldn't remember
conversations on the
document or the events
but the document was correct
at the time of making.
I again enquired as to
the address of the flat &
asked for [REDACTED] & [REDACTED]

to describe where it was
they said they couldn't
remember but it was on the
left hand side as you go
from the town centre. I
asked [REDACTED] was it
beyond the bend in Thomas
Street. He stated that it
was between the British Legion
& the church on the left
hand side - I asked him
did he want to make a
statement he declined. At
8.00 pm the telephone rang &
[REDACTED] answered & said they
had to go. I asked
[REDACTED] was there anything
else he wanted to say
He said there was wasn't
J [REDACTED] & I left. Throughout
any time in the room with
[REDACTED] & [REDACTED] I found
them both to be evasive &
I got the impression they
were telling lies about the
whereabouts of the flat in
Thomas Street. During our
time asking questions about
the whereabouts of the
flat both [REDACTED] &
[REDACTED] went red. Duty
