SIGNATURE OF WITNESS

I am a Detective Constable in the Royal Ulster Constabulary presently attached to the Criminal Investigation Department, South Region. On Sunday 11 May 1997 accompanied by D/Constable McCrumlish I went to the home of Alister Hanvey [REDACTED]. When there we interviewed his parents, Kenneth George Hanvey, DOB [REDACTED], Supervisor NIE and Elizabeth Florence Hanvey, DOB [REDACTED], Cook in School meals, [REDACTED]. They informed us as follows. On Saturday 26 April 1997 Allister got his tea at home. He was then left into Portadown by one of his parents. They were not sure which one left him into Portadown. This is what they normally do. On Sunday morning 27 April 1997 Mr & Mrs Hanvey got up at about 9 am. He fed the cattle while she made the breakfast. At about 9 30 am or 9 45 am Kenneth went to his brothers at [REDACTED] and Allister was there. Kenneth got tea and Allister told his father (Kenneth) about a fight up the town the previous night. Kenneth said "I hope you weren't involved in it". Allister said that he wasn't. They both then went home to [REDACTED] at about 10 30 am. Allister was wearing trainers blue jeans, 'T' shirt not sure of the colour, black bomber jacket - "CAT". Kenneth and Elizabeth both stated that they only heard of the fight when told by

Allister. Kenneth Hanvey also told us that Allister had told him about a Policeman asking him to assist in keeping the crowd back. Mr Hanvey stated that this policeman may give evidence to this effect. Mr Hanvey refused to give details of this policeman. Mr Hanvey also said that rumours were that the first police at the incident were being untruthful about what had happened and had actually instigated the incident. When invited to make a written witness statement both Mr & Mrs Hanvey declined. We had been to the Hanvey home from after lunch and left at 1540 hours. The personal details re Mr & Mrs Hanvey were recorded in my notebook in their home in their presence. The details regarding our conversation with them was recorded a few minutes after we left there home. When we stopped our Police car at the side of the road and wrote up our notebook entry regarding our interview with them.
