I reside at an address known to police. On Saturday 26/04/97 I went to a football match at Hanover, Brownstown. I was along with Philip Curran. I watched a match with Philip and stayed at the club until about 11 pm. Philip and I then went to the Buffs Club until about 1 am or shortly after. We got a taxi from the football club to the Buffs. When we left the Buffs we went to get a Chinese carryout at West Street. We walked to the Chinese and on the way in a young fella going past said they were killing other down the town. I don't know who this young fellow was. We went ahead and got a carryout and then walked down the town through curiosity to see what was happening. As we went down the town I seen an ambulance parked on the street somewhere adjacent to Woodhouse Street. I seen a person lying in the middle of the street close to the ambulance. At the back of the ambulance I seen a fellow I know as Dermott McNeice. I knew Dermott because I had worked with him in Denny's but I hadn't seen him since about September last year because I was off sick. I went over and spoke briefly to Dermott. I said to him, "That's a fucking joke something like that to happen." I meant that I totally disapproved of it. I also spoke briefly to Constable Robbie Atkinson and had a short

general chat with him. That was the only two people I spoke to down the town and I wouldn't even have gone down the town except through curiosity. There was nobody around at that stage that I knew. I only stayed down the town five or ten minutes and then I walked home to have the Chinese. Whilst I was down the street and talking to Dermott they put the chap who was laying on the street into an ambulance and took him away. I didn't know who this person was.
