
On Saturday evening, the 26th April 1997, I got the bus to the Coach in Banbridge. I got on the bus outside the Country Fried Chicken at the bottom of the town. After the Coach was over, I got the bus back about 1 15 am. I was accompanied by [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] got off the bus at Killicomain, and I got off the bus at Herrons Country Fried Chicken at the bottom of the town. This was about 1 45 am. I went up to Boss Hoggs to get something to eat. I stayed in the queue in Boss Hoggs for about 10 minutes and I then walked to the entrance of Wellworths. I stood in the doorway of Wellworths eating my chips. I was quite drunk. I started chatting up a woman in the doorway. I don't know her name. She was about 35 years old. She was drunk also. Whilst standing in the doorway I heard shouting further up the street at Thomas Street and Woodhouse Street. On looking up the street, I saw about 20 people in the middle of the junction. I could see that a fight was taking place, with punches being thrown. I was about 100 yards away, I could not recognise anyone and due to the fact that I was drunk I could not say for definite what was going on. I remember seeing a police landrover in the area and I can remember seeing other police cars arrive in the street. I stayed in Wellworths doorway for

10 - 15 minutes and I then wandered up the main street through the persons still hanging about the Thomas Street/Woodhouse Street junctions. When walking up through this crowd, I saw two men lying on the ground and there was a female tending to one of them. Whilst passing the 2 injured men, I could hear that one of them was breathing very heavily and making alot of noise. I did not recognise anyone standing about in the crowd. I walked up past Jeffers and on up West Street, towards home.
