SIGNATURE OF WITNESS

I am at present a serving member of the Royal Ulster Constabulary full-time Reserve, stationed at Portadown. On Sunday 27 April 1997 I was a member of a mobile patrol on duty in Portadown. At approximately 0147 hrs I received a call from another call sign requesting urgent assistance in Portadown town centre. On arrival in the town centre, at about 0150 hrs and in the area of Thomas Street/Market. I observed police and a large crowd, numbering approximately 30 - 40 persons having a confrontation. I alighted from the patrol vehicle and assisted other police. At approximately 0155 hrs I assisted [REDACTED] with a male youth, now known to me as a Wayne Lunt, [REDACTED], Portadown into the back of a police landrover. I observed that he was wearing a baseball cap, white jeans and a white top with dark coloured stripes on it. I then left the landrover and on the directions of Constable Orr, due to the crowd having gathered in numbers, returned to the police station and signed out a Heckler and Koch Riot gun, marked as No 3 and 25 baton rounds. I then returned to the town centre where the crowd on my arrival was still disorderly. Police then started to push the crowd back towards Church Place and into West Street. Whilst doing so I noticed the following persons in

the crowd and what they were wearing, namely Alaister Hanvey, who was wearing jeans with a dark coloured baseball type jacket with greyish coloured sleeves and also a person known to me as P51,

who was wearing jeans, blue in colour and a navy bomber type jacket. Police finally moved the crowd into West Street and after a short period of time this crowd dispersed and the area became quiet. On my return to the police station I signed the Heckler and Koch Riot gun, marked as No 3 and the 25 baton rounds back into the station armoury.
