I live at an address known to police. My husband is [REDACTED] who is the uncle of Tracy Clarke. I remember hearing about Robert Hamill being assaulted in Portadown. I heard about this the Sunday morning after the incident. Sometime between the following Monday and the next weekend I was speaking to my husband's sister [REDACTED] and her husband Jim Murray. One of them said that Tracy, [REDACTED] s daughter had to go to the police station and she was taken by Andrea McKee to make a statement about what happened the night Robert Hamill was assaulted. I'm not sure whether Alistair Hanvey was going with Tracy at this time. I didn't know whether it was on or off at this time. I mean Tracy and Alistair's relationship. At some stage Jim or [REDACTED] told myself and Steven that Robbie Atkinson had told Alistair Hanvey to burn his clothes. I don't know exactly how they knew this, whether it was Tracy or Alistair who had told them. At some stage during this I'm not sure when, [REDACTED] or Jim told us that Tracy was going to make a statement. Tracy was worried about threats that were being made against her and the fact she was afraid of her home being attacked. [REDACTED] and I told her that she should tell the truth about what happened. She didn't say anything to us except there was a skirmish. She didn't go into detail

with us. I have known Robert and Eleanor Atkinson since about 1993-1994. I know them through the Tae Kwon Do club in Portadown. I used to train in martial arts Tae Kwon Do myself. We didn't mix socially with the Atkinson's except events involving the Tae Kwon Do club. I remember being at a barbecue at their house in Portadown on one occasion. I have been asked about a story that was concocted as a cover for Robert Atkinson that also involved my brother-in-law Michael McKee. I know nothing about this.
