

INTERVIEW OF N298 LYTTLE RE KNOWLEDGE INCIDENT

Called with Mr Lyttle on Thursday 29 May 1997.

Works as Part-Time Barman - Jameson's Bar, Thomas St, Portadown. On duty Saturday night 26 April 97 with other staff, last customer old lady who lives in [REDACTED] left premises between 1 15 - 1 30 am Sunday - 27th. Collected at door by Pete's taxi.

Some time before 2 am not sure of time heard shutters to front of premises banged once, heard shouting from more than one person in Thomas St, but couldn't make out what was being said.

Went to monitor in corner of lounge, shows up Thomas St, observed at least one girl and 3 to 4 fellows run down Thomas St, watched monitor for further while, nothing else seen.

Went to toilet window, other staff already there, looked down Thomas St, observed two fellows down on ground. Fellow wearing black jacket lying level with Thomas St, 3/4 feet into middle of road. Went to front door as other member of staff went outside. Stood at door looked down St, observed fellow with blue shirt, short ginger hair, heavy build being pushed away from scene several times by other youth - No details of this youth. Fellow in blue shirt shouted up the street something like, "I hope yous or happy now." Two girls observed shouting, "Get an ambulance," only observed approximately 10/12 person

running around, didn't observe anybody hit anyone else. Observed one girl help I/P, observed one policeman coming across St, from direction of Building Society. Ambulance arrived. Went back into bar. Nothing further seen.

Refused to make witness statement.
