SIGNATURE OF WITNESS

I am a Paramedic employed by the Northern Ireland Ambulance Service. On Sunday 27th of April 1997, I was on duty accompanied by David Morrow when we received a call to go to Portadown town centre, we arrived at approximately 2 00 am at the junction of Thomas St and Market St. I saw two casualties lying on the roadway, I got out of the ambulance and approached the first casualty a male, who had blood on his face but was fully conscious. I told him to remain and that I would come back to him. On checking the second casualty, also a male, who was further towards the town Church, I found that the patient was unconscious and had markings on the left-hand side of his head and haematomas around the head, I did not see any blood on the second casualty. I commenced first aid to this male and he was put on a stretcher and put into the ambulance. He was given oxygen therapy and transferred to the Accident and Emergency Department at Craigavon Area Hospital, arriving at about 2 10 am. The first casualty that I had saw, managed to walk to the ambulance and a third casualty with blood coming from his nose also travelled to the hospital in the ambulance. At about 5 30 am, I transferred the patient whom I now know as Robert Hamill, the second casualty that I dealt with at the scene in
