I am a Detective Constable of the Royal Ulster Constabulary GC, presently attached to the Criminal Investigation Department, South Region. On Tuesday 13th May 1997 at 1150 hrs I spoke with Christopher Henderson, [REDACTED] at his home. I asked him about his movements after 2 am on 27th April 1997. He told me he had stayed at the bottom of the town (Portadown), talking until around 3 am then he walked up through the town with Ian Carville, [REDACTED] looking for a party. They went to [REDACTED] in [REDACTED] (exact address not known); [REDACTED] was either not in or asleep so they didn't get in. They walked from there round to Tracey McAlpine's in [REDACTED] - (exact address again not known but described [REDACTED]) - he used to go out with her, getting to her house at approximately 5 am in the morning. There were about 5 people in the living room, some more were asleep upstairs, he didn't know whom but Tracey McAlpine was apparently in bed asleep/sick. In the living room were Alister Hanvey, [P46], possibly Dean Forbes (unsure) and a girl Kelly Lavery. There was no talk about the fight but he believed that it might have been mentioned casually, but no talk of who did what or anything
