DCI McAttee states that he finished duty at 5pm that day and then went to the homes of the McNeill and D, E & F families was the only inquiries he carried out regarding the McNeill investigation that day. After that he started duty at 9am on Thursday 8/1/97 and was involved in other Sub Division crime matters up until tea time on 8/5/97 after changing a promise in a log at 4.35pm. Early evening on 8/5/97, DCI McAttee recalls a local politician Jerry McCaw coming into the office to speak to him. DCI McAttee cannot recall exactly what McCaw told him but believes that he mentioned the name Tracy Clarke and that she was at the incident on the spot in question and may have witnessed something - states that he would have spoken to a senior officer about it but does not recall which senior officer he spoke to - states that he then went with S/S Bradley to the home of Tracy Clarke at [redacted] where they interviewed her. Does not recall how he found out about the address in [redacted]. States that he completed a questionnaire and also spoke to her mother and father prior to her coming down stairs - she had been in the bedroom when we arrived - states that Tracy Clarke, S/S Bradley and himself went into another room and he completed a questionnaire which was timed at 8pm. - states that the time of 8pm would have been recorded near the time of completing the interview. She gave information which didn't appear to reflect what McCaw had earlier said to him. Also recalls that he was told by McCaw at some point, not sure when, that the person he was talking to was Tracy Clarke's Aunt. DCI McAttee states that S/S Bradley and himself left the house and returned to Portlaoine Police Station - states that Tracy Clarke was left in the house with her parents at that time. DCI McAttee states that when they got back to the CID office, McCaw was contacted and DCI McAttee recalls that it was him who
