SIGNATURE OF WITNESS

I am a Full Time Reserve Constable in the Royal Ulster Constabulary presently stationed at Craigavon RUC Station. Further to my statement dated 27th April 1997 regarding the disturbance in Portadown Town Center on the same date. I can say that I did have a previous dealing with Alister Hanvey, ██████████. I dealt with a road traffic accident which Hanvey was involved in on 22nd March 1997 at Tavanagh Avenue, Portadown where another vehicle ran into the rear of his vehicle. The driver of the other vehicle ██████████, ██████████ ██████████ was prosecuted for a number of driving offences. In relation to the night of 27th April 1997 I can say that I did see Alister Hanvey somewhere in Portadown town centre during the disturbances. He was amongst a crowd either at the junction of Thomas Street/High Street/Market Street or in West Street when the loyalist crowd had been pushed back. I do not recall what clothing Hanvey was wearing nor can I say what he was actually doing. However if I had seen him or observed him committing any offence I would have noted it. I did not speak to Alister Hanvey on the street that night. I have been asked if I saw R/Constable Atkinson talking to anyone during these disturbances. I cannot say that I saw him speak to
