9. I am now aware that the taxi driver was called Anthony Byrne and that he remembers picking me and my husband up. I know he called **P132** at some stage; I have not spoken to him. I do not know if **P132** knew Mr Byrne. He knew that it was A-2-B Taxis that brought us home and he knew several of the drivers from working there.
10. I have been told that Mr Byrne said that I said we had been chased and that I had fallen and cut my knees. There was nobody coming after us; we were definitely not being chased and I did not fall or cut my knees. **P132** tripped when we were running down Woodhouse Street; he fell and ripped his trousers but it was only a wee cut. We were only running because I wanted to get down the town. I would say that we started to run just before the Queen's bar and ran across the main road into Woodhouse Street until we got to the Royal Oak. We had both had a few drinks as well but I would not say that my memory was affected.
11. I do not remember seeing Thomas Mallon at all that night. I do not remember seeing anybody to be honest. There were no members of the public or the police around the Land Rover when we passed it.
12. The first time I heard that **D** and Robert Hamill had been assaulted was when **P132** got a phone call from one of his sisters, I think it might have been **E**, crying and saying that she was at the hospital and they had been attacked. Then **P132** went over to the hospital. This was probably in the early hours of the morning on 27<sup>th</sup> April. I did not go to the hospital with **P132**. I do not remember what time he came back but he would not have been there all day. Then he told me what had happened. This was my first inkling of what exactly had happened. **E** and **F** have spoken to us about what happened that night since then.
